I spoke but the council really paid attention to our four Youth rowers who spoke, Kai, Ellie, Audrey and Imani, who charmed everyone. The Sam Chastain Trail completion project came up, which I wanted to address with Council members anyway, which just goes to show the value of showing up and being involved. Thank you Rachel for finding the students and organizing our report. Several community activists were in the audience plus Renton city administrators, so we had an audience larger than just the council members.
